JOHN J. FINAN, JR.

John J. Finan, Jr. is the president and CEO of Franciscan Missionaries of Our Lady Health System, Inc. He is a former chair of the board of trustees of the Catholic Health Association and former member of the American Hospital Association Board of Trustees.
